This is because these activities can raise the level of serotonin, a chemical in our body and brain. More serotonin can make us feel happier, sleep better, and less anxious.

A study reported by Utah State University found that making art can reduce stress. After creating art, they saw that about 75% of people in the study had lower cortisol levels, a stress hormone. Spending time on hobbies that let you learn and gain new skills is important. Henry Ford said, "Anyone who stops learning is old, whether at twenty or eighty. Anyone who keeps learning stays young."

#### **SEW INTERESTING**

The history of clothing irons dates back thousands of years, with people using heated rocks to smooth animal hides as early as 40,000 years ago. Other early methods included using smooth wooden or glass pieces and a pounding stick before the 10th century, and metal paddles used by the ancient Romans to beat clothes. Blacksmiths also experimented with flat irons in the Middle Ages, which were the precursors to today's electric irons.

Here are some notable developments in the history of irons: 400 B.C.: The Greeks used a round bar called a goffering iron to create pleats on robes

1882: Henry W. Seeley of New York City patented the first resistively heated electric iron


1883: The first electric flat iron was patented

1920s: Thermostatically controlled irons became available

1934: Max Skolnik patented an electric steam iron

1938: The first steam iron was introduced

1940s: Electrically charged steam irons became popular, with Thomas Sears credited for the original concept
